### 2.0 Section Concerns:

- 2.1 Health Sciences Charter School Classification The Section VI Boys Basketball Committee, with a vote of 5-0, proposes to reclassify Health Sciences from Class B to either Class AA or Class A for the 2017-2018 season. The following details the committee's rationale for the proposal:
  - Health Sciences reached the Sectional finals in Class B2 during the 2015-16 season, finishing the season with a record of 18-4. Last season (2016-17), they finished with a 21-5 record, winning the Section VI Class B title, winning the Regional Championship in Rochester, and finally losing in the State Class B semi-final game in Binghamton.
  - Seven seniors will not be returning this season. However, six of those seniors combined to score only 38 total points on the season. Those 6 almost never played. They did start 1 senior who was a contributing member of the team, scoring just under 10 points a game.
  - This coming season, they are returning 4 starters from a State semi-finalist team, along with 2 or 3 others that contributed from the bench. One starter was All-WNY and has already committed to the University of Tennessee. Another was honorable mention All-WNY. They returned 63 points per game from last year's roster, and of course, are all a year older and more experienced. To put that in perspective, most teams will generally return 20-25 points from returning players each season.
  - Last season, they won 12 of their games by 20 or more points, 9 of those games were won by more than 30 points, and 6 of those were won by 40 or more. The teams they lost to during the season were North Tonawanda (won Sectional Class A1 title), St. Francis (won the MMA title for Large Schools), Bishop Timon (All-WNY player and Large School MMA semi-finalist), and MEC (Large School Division in Buffalo, State Class C Champion 2016).
  - Another concern is student-athletes from other schools that seem to become Health Science students. While they have a lottery system for enrollment, they seem to have "special circumstances" that allow others to enter.

Based on all of these factors, the committee feels moving Health Sciences to a higher Classification will help maintain a competitive balance within the Section.

Violation of the May deadline for this proposal as stipulated in Policy #511 (*An annual report on the competitive placement of each Charter School will be made by the school and the league in which the school was placed to the Section VI Special Committee on Charter Schools by mid-April. The Committee will review the reports and recommend placement for the following year at the May Athletic Council meeting.) will be brought forth to the Athletic Council at the November meeting for discussion.* 

#### 2.2 Cheerleading Classification Proposal

Section VI has previously approved to allow 10% of each Cheerleading Division to move on to the State Championships after Sectional finals. This is determined by having the Sectional winner in each Division move on to the State competition. If there are more than 10 in a Division then it will be the Sectional winner plus the school or schools with the next highest scores.

 Proposal: To divide Division 2 Small (BEDS 750 or less) into classifications (B, C, D) of equal numbers, send the winner of each classification and the additional team(s) will be determined by the next highest scores within the entire division.
Effective Start Date: Winter 2017-18 season
