#### 4.8 Officials Contract Negotiations (Changes in Modified Soccer and Modified Lacrosse)

At the July 2019 NYSPHSAA Central Committee meeting, action items to change the length of quarters from 9 minutes to 10 minutes per quarter including overtime in the sport of modified lacrosse and going from four 15-minute quarters to two 40-minutes halves in the sport of modified soccer were approved. Due to the increase in length of quarters in each of these sports, Section VI will begin negotiations with the WNYSO regarding a commensurate rate for officials.

In preparation for the change to modified soccer in 2020, Section VI will pilot two 30-minute halves for the 2019 season.

#### 4.9 Aspiring AD Program

NYSAAA Chapter 6 representatives, M. DiFilippo (Chairman), M. Fallacaro-Dougherty (Staff Development), and B. Banker (President), are finalizing the initiative to institute Aspiring Athletic Director and Staff Development programs. Every other month professional development will be offered for current athletic director's as well as aspiring athletic directors. The first offering is October 21, 2019.
